AMAZON LEADER CONFERENCE

Another conference in the Amazon is in the books! We returned from Brazil in May where members of our leadership team traveled upriver to speak to 50 local leaders over several days about running community initiatives with excellence through unity among one another and cross-collaboration with other organizational leaders.

Most of the leaders commuted to the conference by rowing for hours by canoe from their different villages up the Amazon river. In the evenings when the conference day ended it would already be dark. A normal part of life there, the leaders would return home with their cell phone for light in one hand and a paddle in the other to navigate their way home. The critical need for connection and their passion, commitment and sacrifice to the work these leaders do was a reminder to us about the importance of showing up.



The foundation of everything we do is relationships. Because it is out of relationship that true and lasting transformation takes place. Therefore, a highlight of our time was sharing meals during the week together with the local leaders and their families. We also visited several of the leaders' initiatives and visited a school. It was a delight to connect with many of the elementary and middle school students to talk about the importance of having dreams and a vision for their life combined with discipline in studying and collaboration with others.

Having now returned to this location several times, we have been able to build deeper and more impactful relationships. We heard many testimonies sharing how they have been able to implement the things they learned at the previous conference and are seeing improvements in their community. Things like collaborating not just with the adults within their own initiatives but with the children and cross- collaboration with leaders of other initiatives. Wow!

It is a true joy and inspiration to see the impact and fruit from these leaders' work - their vision and ability to see potential, their heart for their community members, their consistency in showing up, and the intentionality with which they work. This combination is powerful, and we are witnessing mountain moving impact.

During the conference sessions in the Amazon, the leaders broke off into small groups to discuss the importance of clear communication for effective leadership. In one of the breakout sessions, a local leader shared his excitement for how the communication tools he was learning in this conference would help lead his team better. As he was sharing this, he began to cry because at that moment, we understood how it would not only help him better lead his team, but it would help him become a better husband and a father. He explained that he had always thought that many of the challenges he faced on his team and in life had been a lack of discipline or willingness of others. As he learned the tools taught in the conference, he realized that by improving his own communication skills, and thus his leadership skills, he would have a healthier family and also set his team up for success to have an even larger positive collective impact.

True leadership starts at home. For all the work the leaders do in their villages, ensuring the they are healthy and equipped on the individual and nuclear level is where the foundational and sustainable transformation flows.





MANAUS BJJ WORKSHOP

DreamRoot Programs Director, Tony Passos conducted a jiu jitsu (BJJ) workshop for students in Manaus near the Amazon river in Brazil. The objective of the event was to train and encourage the program's instructors, while also connecting with the youth and kids in the community.

The jiu jitsu community initiative is led by Rodrigo and his team of assistant coaches. They are a dedicated group that works largely with kids and teenagers in tough situations using jiu jitsu as a tool to teach life skills and mentor youth towards a path of success.

During the workshop, Tony valuable insights on leadership within the context of Brazilian Jiu Jitsu and class facilitation tools. Practical tips were provided to enhance the instructors' ability to lead engaging and effective classes.

Tony actively engaged the students and fostered a transformational learning environment as he demonstrated techniques, sparred, and shared life lessons. He shared a inspiring words of wisdom about hard work, resilience, integrity and the power of dreams.



A trusted guest speaker can be a fresh voice for young people. Tony's unique voice resonated with the young people, complementing the ongoing guidance from their instructors. The instructors continue to mentor and work with the students weekly and are seeing transformation not just in their lives but in their families at home.

We are looking forward to hosting Rodrigo along with many other local leaders across the nation in Recife, Brazil for the DreamRoot local leader workshop in October.

Jiu-jitsu is just a tool. The academy is just a platform. It is all about relationships.
